

Nordic Award for Surface and Colloid Chemistry

Since 1985 the AkzoNobel Nordic Research Award for Surface and Colloid Chemistry has been awarded. The prize consists of travelling scholarships or the like, up to 50,000 SEK. The amount can be split among several winners. The prize is awarded to outstanding younger researchers within this area. The committee that is electing the winners consists of Lennart Piculell, Krister Holmberg, Per Claesson, Peter Westbye and Leif Karlson. Normally the award winners should have taken a doctor's degree within the last 4 year period. When choosing the winner, both research work within the frame of dissertation and later research achievements should be taken into consideration. The award winner should have documented **independent research on a high international level within the area of surface and colloid chemistry**. If no winner can be found the prize money can be carried over to the next year.
